Health & Safety Audit

Recently, the school had a health and safety audit carried out. The school achieved a score of 88% (the pass rate is 65%). Thank you and well done to Mrs Roberts and Mrs Steele for all their hard work.

Attendance

We must highlight our attendance percentages because each week we are seeing more and more red attendance. We appreciate that some of our attendance is affected by illness, but it is important that your child attends school where possible. Staff will begin to carry out home visits where children are identified to be regular non-attenders.

Red Themed Non-uniform (Wear Red) – 17^{th} November

Next Friday (17th November), we are having a red themed non-uniform day in aid our St Joseph's Children's Home and Aid to the Church in Need (Red Wednesday - moved to the Friday), which are both very worthwhile charities and projects. The money raised will be split between the two charities. In addition, Our Lady of Furness Craft Group will be running a coffee morning and some stalls (tombola, preserves, sweets, crafts, etc) in St Joseph's Cabin from 9:30am until approx. 10:30am. Family members are welcome to attend. Children may bring a small amount of money in a named and sealed envelope to spend and staff will assist them. All money raised by the Craft Group will go to St Joseph's Children's Home.

On Tuesday 5th December any remaining tickets will be released on a first come, first serve basis.

Nativity Outfits

Children may come to school dressed in their outfits ready for the Nativity Performances but must bring their uniform in a bag to get changed into. This will save their outfits from being spoiled at lunchtime. This includes the dress rehearsal on Monday 11th December (am).

Performances and the School Bus

We appreciate that getting pupils back to school for 4:30pm may be difficult for parents whose children arrive home on the school bus after 4pm. We ask, where possible, that parents pick their children up as a one off on their child's nativity performance day. However, we have employed an additional member of staff for After School Club for those children who aren't able to be picked up. The session must be booked directly via the school office, and a payment of £2 will be charged to School Hub. Parents/carers must provide children with a packed tea. To confirm, this is only available for pupils who get the school bus and arrive back home after 4pm.

Christmas Jumper Day – 18th December

We are encouraging everyone to get into the festive spirit by wearing a Christmas jumper on Monday 18th December to raise funds for our local Children's Ward (Bay Hospitals Charity).

Children in Need/St Joseph's Children's Home/Red Wednesday – 17th November

We recognise that Children in Need is a national event, and many children and families want to take part in their fundraising activities. However, when giving money to a large body like Children in Need, children do not always see how the funds they raise benefit other people. As a Catholic school, we are encouraged to look for Catholic charities that support similar aims to national charities and provide resources to help children understand charitable giving as part of the Catholic character of our school. As a Catholic school, we teach about charity as a virtue, a habit we want to develop because it makes for rounded individuals. We encourage children to fundraise not just for fun, but because their charitable gifts help to make the world a better place for others. Therefore, instead of raising money for Children in Need, we will raise funds for St Joseph's Children's Home in India. The children's home (church and school) was set up by Fr Ajish (our Assistant Priest). Fr Ajish and parishioners visit St Joseph's on a regular basis and pupils will be able to see the impact their fundraising and charitable gifts have on the children's lives – children who are less fortunate than them. Photographs and videos will be shared with our pupils. Children can come to school in non-uniform and make donations via the bucket or School Hub. Children are asked to wear the colour red as it is often worn to celebrate St Joseph's feast day.
