Catholic Education

I would like to inform you of issue regarding the future of Catholic schools like ours and Catholic Education in general. The Most Reverend Malcolm McMahon OP, Archbishop of Liverpool, has asked us to contact all our parents and parishioners, as he sees this as the biggest ever threat to the future of Catholic Education in our country.

At the election Teresa May committed to removing the 50% admissions cap in the Conservative manifesto, this has not happened and looks like the government will not deliver on their promise.

To put this into context: It may mean that in the future Catholics would not get a place in a Catholic school, as the governors would only be allowed to offer half the places to Catholics. Every class in our school has more than 50% baptised Catholics, this ruling would have a catastrophic impact on Catholic families and our school communities.

I urge you to type in the link http://catholicnews.org.uk/education-cap into your internet browser to sign a petition regarding the future of Catholic Education.

All it asks for is your name and address and an agreement to the letter below:

Dear Secretary of State,

As a Catholic, I firmly believe in the right to a Catholic education. I am also proud that our schools are historically diverse and inclusive to children of all faiths and none. However, I am alarmed to learn that there is a cap in place which prevents new Catholic schools from admitting some Catholic pupils on the basis of their faith.

At the election, the Government committed to removing the 50% admissions cap in their manifesto. In addition to this, you have previously stated in the House of Commons that the cap was ineffective and acknowledged the impact this had on Catholics in particular.

I would ask you to consider your promise to the electorate and remove the 50% faith admissions cap allowing all Catholics who want to provide a Catholic education to be able to do so. In keeping your promise, you will also show the Catholic community that equality includes the right to practice a faith.
