Dear Parents/Carers,

It is hard to believe it has nearly been a whole year since schools closed for the first time and St Pius X became a hub school for families across Barrow. Now we find ourselves in a third national lockdown and once again our school has remained open for vulnerable pupils and children of critical workers.

The last six weeks has not been easy but I am amazed at how our pupils, parents, staff and governors have responded and coped with the challenges these unprecedented times have presented. I am extremely proud of our school community.

The government have announced that schools in England will not return until 8th March 2021, at the earliest. Schools have been promised two weeks' notice of the government's plans of how the return will look. Therefore, we are expecting further guidance on Monday 22nd February. I will communicate with you as soon as the guidance is released.

We've completed six weeks of remote learning (whoop whoop!) and we know we have at least another two weeks to face once we return after half term. Again, I am impressed with the number of children who have engaged with remote learning, whether that is via live Zoom lessons, accessing and completing work set on Showbie/Tapestry or a combination of both. I would like to remind you that we still have laptops available from the School Office. Devices are available for all families and include those who are sharing a device, working from a phone, etc. Please remember that these devices remain the property of the school and are only loaned to families. They must be returned when school returns.

Morrisons are donating 30 pizza making kits to our school for families during half-term. This is open to any family, regardless of the circumstances. Please send me a message on Class Dojo if you'd like a kit. First come, first served.

I am pleased to inform you that our school family continues to grow. We have four new pupils and a new member of staff starting with us after half-term. Mr Turner will be joining our team and will be supporting a pupil in Year 4. I am sure you will make them all very welcome.

We have made it to the end of a half-term without any COVID cases in school and without any bubble closures. What a relief! Let's hope our run of luck continues after half-term. Again, I would like to remind families to follow the government guidance. By doing so you are keeping our staff and community safe and are helping to stop the spread of the virus. Unfortunately, I have had to withdraw some school places this

term due to families not following the guidance. I appreciate there is a lot of information so I have included links below to allow you to familiarise yourselves with the guidance.
