Tickets will be limited to 2 people for the infant performance and 2 people for the junior performance (per child). Please provide names of attendees. The deadline to purchase tickets is 3rd December at noon. If we have remaining tickets, we will inform you. If your child comes to and from school on the school bus or goes to Breakfast/After School Club please place the correct money in an envelope with your child's name, year group, who will be attending, number of tickets you require (2 max.) and which performance you wish to attend (morning, afternoon or evening).
